# 《香港一處有特色的地方》

據說這座教堂是香港最古老的建築之一,的確,教堂內部的那種裝飾、那種氣息、那種神聖,凝重的味道至今都讓我回味無窮,意猶未盡不得不讓人拍手稱奇。這種中西合學,風格獨一無二的設計,難道不是香港一處有特色的地方嗎?

There are over seventy-five thousand mentally disabled people in Hong Kong. Most of them have to face the negative attitudes of the normal people. Some people think the mentally disabled are frightening or that mentally disabled people don't have feelings. In fact, that's not true. Everyone is equal. No matter how they look, all of the mentally disabled people have feelings. The negative attitudes will hurt them a lot. Maybe some of the mentally disabled get teased or are bullied.

Mentally disabled people are not monsters. We should talk to them more. They are not so unusual. We should get close with them and care about them. We can open an exhibition to let people know more about the mentally disabled. Through fact sheets, cartoons and quizzes, the exhibition would aim to change negative attitudes towards the mentally disabled. We also can visit some special schools and spend a day with them. We can participate in activities with mentally disabled kids.

So, as you can see, the government and the schools can organize some events to let normal people and mentally disabled have more contact. Also, some charities could organize talks for schools. Let's care about the mentally disabled people and not be so callous.
